Recent Developments

Global News

- The World Health Organization (WHO) said in a statement Tuesday that COVID-19 remains a global emergency. "New waves of the virus demonstrate again that COVID-19 is nowhere near over," WHO Director-General told a news conference, voicing concern the virus is "running freely".
- Australian Prime Minister has called a snap meeting next week as he <u>faces pressure</u> to reinstate compensation pay for casual workers forced to isolate due to COVID-19 amid <u>a fresh wave of infections</u>.

Regional News

- China's financial hub <u>Shanghai</u> has ordered the majority of the city's 16 districts to <u>undergo two rounds of testing</u> from Tuesday to Thursday, after a case of the new BA.5.2.1 subvariant was detected in the community on July 8.
- Japan warned on Thursday that a new wave of coronavirus infections appeared to be spreading rapidly and <u>urged people to take special care</u> ahead of an approaching long weekend and school summer vacations. Tokyo <u>raised its alert level to the highest tier</u>.
- Hong Kong could see <u>quarantine-free travel by November</u> in time for a global bankers summit with conditions, as <u>forecast by the new secretary for Health</u> Lo Chung-Mau in an interview Wednesday.
- The Korea Disease Control and Prevention Agency (KDCA) confirmed the country has entered a new wave of COVID-19 and raised the nationwide risk level of the virus by one notch from "Low" to "Moderate" for the first time in eight weeks.

Vaccine News


- The U.S. Food and Drug Administration <u>authorized the use of Novavax</u> Inc's COVID-19 vaccine <u>for adults</u> ages 18 and over on Wednesday. The shot is based on <u>more</u> <u>conventional protein technology</u> used for decades in hepatitis B and HPV vaccines.
- <u>Pfizer and BioNTech</u> are <u>seeking approval</u> of their COVID-19 vaccine from **Japan**'s health ministry for use in children aged <u>six months to four years.</u>




ASEAN+3: Daily New Cases by Size of Population
