Recent Developments

Global News

- New COVID-19 infections are on the rise again in France and people should consider wearing masks on public transport or when in contact with vulnerable people, French government officials said on Tuesday.
- Covid <u>cases are continuing to rise</u> across **Australia**, but health authorities remain confident the <u>peak will hit before Christmas</u>.

Regional News

- China's Vice Premier Sun Chunlan said Wednesday that the country's battle against Covid-19 is facing new circumstances that require a new approach as the virus becomes less pathogenic, more people get vaccinated, and experience is gained.
- Some **Chinese** cities where Covid-19 is <u>still spreading</u> are <u>easing off</u> on <u>testing</u> requirements and <u>quarantine rules</u> ahead of an expected shift in policies nationwide.
- **Japan** will <u>consider reclassifying</u> COVID-19 into a <u>less-severe infectious disease</u> category, such as the one for seasonal flu, the health minister said on Nov 29.
- Japan's <u>education ministry</u> released a notification on Nov 29 confirming that <u>students</u> are allowed to talk with each other <u>during lunchtime</u> if schools take appropriate COVID-19 countermeasures.
- Hong Kong's Covid-19 <u>caseload on Thursday surged past the 10,000</u> marks for the <u>first time since</u> a previous rebound in infections in <u>September</u>, while the death toll in the past week rose by more than 40 percent.

Vaccine News


- **China** aims to <u>inoculate 90%</u> of people <u>aged 80 and above</u> with <u>at least one shot</u> by the <u>end of January</u>, part of its effort to be able to ease its zero-Covid policy.
- The world's <u>first intra-nasal vaccine</u> for COVID developed by <u>India</u> has <u>got approval</u> from the Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO) for <u>restricted use</u> in <u>emergencies</u> in the age group of <u>18 and above</u>.



(7-day average; thousand cases)





(0 = no restrictions, 100 = tightest restrictions)

Note: The stringency index records the strictness of "lockdown-style" policies that primarily restrict people's behavior. The index is a composite measure based on nine response indicators: (1) school closing; (2) workplace closing; (3) cancellation of public events; (4) restrictions on gatherings; (5) closure of public transport; (6) stay-at-home requirements; (7) restrictions on internal movement; (8) international travel controls; and (9) public information campaigns. The indicators are scaled to a value from 0 to 100 (100 = tightest). ASEAN-5 = Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore, and Thailand; BCLMV = Brunei, Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar, and Vietnam.
