Recent Developments

Global News

- As of yesterday, worldwide <u>new cases have fallen by about 12 percent on a week-on-week basis</u>, the fourth straight week of decline. Global deaths have also eased, albeit at a slower pace of about 5 percent.
- Australia has <u>lifted its mask mandate on domestic and inbound international flights</u> effective today. Health authorities will shift to weekly reporting of COVID-19 statistics by tomorrow, with the first weekly report to be issued on September 16.
- **Germany** will soon <u>drop mask requirements on commercial flights</u>. Instead, authorities will focus on enforcing face-and-mouth coverings for those using public transport.

Regional News

- **China** is <u>tightening COVID-19 restrictions on domestic travel beginning tomorrow until</u> <u>the end of October</u>. All passengers on planes, trains, interprovincial buses, and ferries are required to show a negative PCR test result from the previous 48 hours.
- Hong Kong will <u>include kids aged five and above in its vaccine pass scheme by the</u> <u>end of this month to help boost vaccination coverage</u>. Children aged 5 to 11 will be required to have one dose starting September 30, and two doses by November 30.
- Indonesia is aiming to begin preparations for a phased pandemic-to-endemic transition by early 2023, especially if the domestic virus situation remains well under control until end of this year.
- Malaysia has <u>scrapped its indoor mask rule earlier this week, in line with its transition</u> to the endemic phase of COVID-19. Premise owners, nonetheless, may still enforce rules requiring their visitors to wear masks.

Vaccine News

- China last weekend <u>approved for emergency use the world's first inhalable COVID-19</u> <u>vaccine—called Convidecia Air—to be administered as a booster</u>. Developed by CanSino Biologics, the dose will be given through a nebulizer.
- India <u>approved a home-grown, nasally-administered vaccine</u> last Tuesday, developed by Bharat Biotech. It has been allowed as a primary dose, but not as a booster.





ASEAN+3 and Selected Economies: Vaccination Coverage Status (Percent of population)




