# **Recent Developments**

## **Global News**

- The World Health Organisation (WHO) has <u>warned that the possibility</u> of the emergence of <u>deadlier and more infectious coronavirus variants</u> remains and urged all to <u>continue to practice caution</u> during the weekly media briefing on <u>Wednesday</u>.
- Australia on <u>Wednesday</u> announced <u>mandatory Covid-19 isolation</u> would be <u>cut from</u> <u>seven to five days</u> for people without symptoms and <u>mask requirements lifted</u> on <u>domestic flights</u> from <u>September 9</u>.

## **Regional News**

- Several of China's <u>biggest cities</u> including Chengdu, Guangzhou, Harbin, and Shenzhen, have <u>stepped up COVID-19 restrictions</u> <u>this week</u>, curtailing the activities of tens of millions of people.
- **Hong Kong**'s Chief Executive announced <u>Thursday</u> that he had <u>secured preliminary</u> <u>backing</u> from mainland Chinese authorities for a "<u>reverse quarantine</u>" scheme allowing travellers to undergo isolation in the city first before heading across the border.
- Prime Minister said <u>Wednesday</u> that **Japan** will <u>allow the entry of non-escorted visitors</u> on package tours and <u>raise the daily arrival cap</u> to 50,000 starting <u>September 7</u>.
- Korea will <u>lift its current pre-departure COVID-19 test requirement</u> for inbound travellers starting September 3, Second Vice Health Minister said <u>Wednesday</u>.

#### Vaccine News

- **Canada** <u>authorized Moderna's bivalent</u> COVID-19 shots <u>on Thursday</u>, in the country's first approval of a vaccine targeting both the original virus and the Omicron variant.
- The European Medicines Agency (EMA) on <u>Thursday</u> backed <u>the use of</u> <u>Novavax's COVID-19 shot as a booster</u> for adults, ahead of an anticipated rise in infections this winter.
- The **U.S.** Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) on <u>Thursday</u> recommended the use of redesigned COVID-19 booster shots for people aged 12 years and older to <u>target the BA.4 and BA.5</u> Omicron subvariants of the coronavirus.

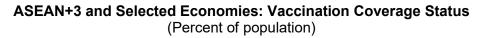

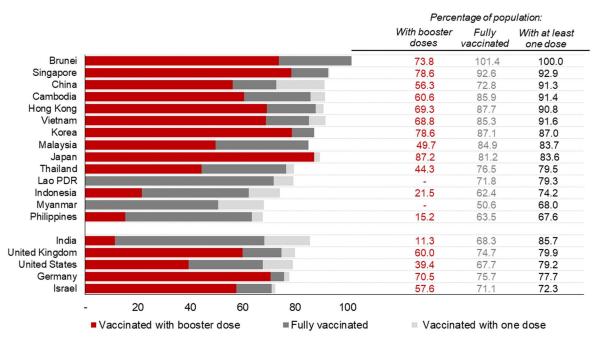

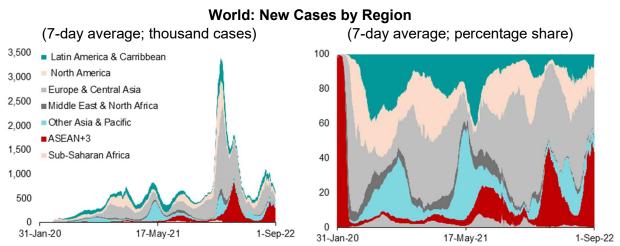

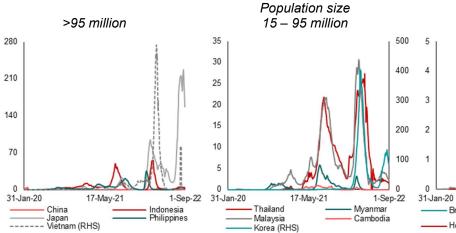

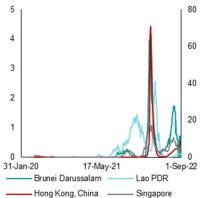


ASEAN+3: Daily New Cases by Size of Population (7-day average; thousand cases)





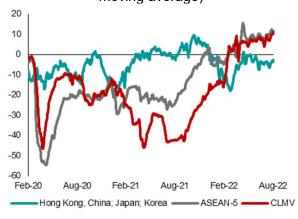
