Recent Developments

Global News

<u>Daily new cases</u> in <u>India surpassed the 7,000-mark for the second day yesterday, driven by <u>Omicron sub-variants</u>. Despite the rise in infections, most have mild symptoms that resolve within 2 to 3 days and require no hospitalization.

Regional News

- In **China**, Shanghai officials announced yesterday that <u>several of the city's 16 districts</u> would carry out PCR testing over the next two days, following the discovery of fresh cases in the community. Some areas will carry out "closed management," where residents will have to remain at home during the testing period.
- Japan today resumed its visa procedures to accept foreign tourists, initially limiting eligible arrivals to guided tours from economies assessed as having the lowest risk of infection, including China, Indonesia, Korea, and Thailand.
- Korea is planning to <u>conduct a large-scale survey on "long COVID" in order to make</u> <u>guidelines for the treatment of post COVID-19 conditions</u>. Daily new cases have fallen below 10,000 yesterday, the second straight day of decline.
- Omicron sub-variants BA.5 and BA.2.12.1—reported to be more transmissible strains—were detected in 2 cases in **Malaysia**, according to health officials yesterday.

Vaccine News


- Cambodia <u>kicked off its fifth COVID-19 dose campaign yesterday, starting with health</u> workers, the elderly, and those with low immunity. The interval between the fifth and prior dose is at least three months.
- United States has outlined its plan to make <u>COVID-19 vaccines available to about 18 million children younger than 5 years old</u>, once cleared by regulators. The first doses from Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech could be given out starting June 19.
- Early trials of <u>an updated version</u> of <u>Moderna</u>'s vaccine <u>produced an eightfold</u> <u>increase in antibody levels against Omicron</u>, opening up the likelihood of a once-a-year COVID-19 booster. The updated vaccine is <u>"bivalent"</u>, <u>which specifically targets Omicron and the original strain in a single shot</u>.

ASEAN+3 and Selected Economies: Vaccination Coverage Status (Percent of population)






World: New Cases by Region

ASEAN+3: Daily New Cases by Size of Population


(7-day average; thousand cases)

Selected ASEAN+3: COVID-19 Hospitalizations


(Thousand persons)
