## **Recent Developments**

#### **Global News**

 <u>Daily new infections</u> in **South Africa** crossed the 10,000-threshold on Wednesday for the first time since January 2022, as health authorities warn of the fifth wave driven by two Omicron sub-variants. The provinces of Gauteng and KwaZulu-Natal are emerging hotspots, accounting for sixty percent of the new cases.

#### **Regional News**

- In Singapore, health authorities <u>indicated that there is "no evidence of a new wave,"</u> <u>despite a recent increase in community cases</u>, and that this trend had been expected given the easing of restrictions since late-April.
- Korea yesterday pledged <u>an additional KRW300 million to the World Health</u> <u>Organization (WHO)-led global initiative to fund COVID-19 tests, treatments, and</u> <u>vaccines</u> for low-income economies.
- Published yesterday in the Lancet, a study by researchers in **China** revealed that <u>about half of previously hospitalized COVID-19 patients in Wuhan still report at least</u> <u>one symptom two years after infection</u>, including fatigue and muscle weakness.
- Authorities in **Japan** are reportedly considering <u>exempting certain inbound travellers</u> <u>from the COVID-19 test required at ports of entry</u>, and this could start next month.
- **Myanmar** will start <u>allowing tourists to apply for visas by this Sunday, May 15,</u> after more than two years, to help restart the tourism sector.

#### Vaccine News

- **Malaysia** yesterday granted <u>conditional approval to AstraZeneca's Evusheld</u>, which could be given to those who may not have adequate immune response to vaccination.
- The United States will share technologies used to make COVID-19 vaccines through the WHO, and it will also contribute an additional USD200 million to the World Bank's global health fund for future pandemic preparedness.
- **Moderna** has <u>submitted its application to US authorities for emergency use of its</u> COVID-19 vaccine in adolescents aged 12 to 17 years, children aged 6 to 11, and <u>between 6 years and 6 months</u>. The application will be reviewed next month.





## ASEAN+3 and Selected Economies: Vaccination Coverage Status (Percent of population)




