Recent Developments

Global News

- **South Africa** is preparing to offer booster doses of the Pfizer-BioNTech and Johnson & Johnson (J&J) vaccines. The J&J booster was initially only available for health workers.
- Australia will <u>administer Pfizer-BioNTech vaccines to children aged 5 to 11</u> starting January 10, 2022, at eight-week interval. Suitability of Moderna doses are being studied.
- Cases of the <u>omicron variant has been doubling every three days</u> in the UK. Authorities have cautioned that if recent growth rate continues, <u>at least 50 percent of cases in the next 2-4 weeks are likely to be caused by the omicron variant.</u>

Regional News

- Japan has confirmed <u>eight more cases of the omicron variant</u>, bringing the total number of omicron infections to 12 to-date. All eight new cases were imported.
- **Singapore** has reported <u>its first locally transmitted case of the omicron variant</u>. **Singapore** will <u>receive AstraZeneca's COVID-19 antibody cocktail</u>, <u>Evusheld</u>, <u>by year-end</u>. Evusheld offers additional protection, alongside vaccines to high risk individuals</u>.
- Korea will further reduce the interval for booster doses from 4-5 months to three, in a bid to stem record-high increases in infections.
- Indonesia has <u>cancelled its planned a nationwide year-end holiday-season restrictions</u> <u>following high vaccination coverage and improved testing capacity.</u> Mobility restrictions will vary depending on the situation in each district.

Vaccine News

- The **US** Food and Drug Administration has <u>authorized Pfizer-BioNTech booster shots</u> for 16- and 17-year-olds. New data suggests <u>that boosters likely bolster immune</u> defenses against the new omicron variant.
- China has <u>approved two local COVID-19 neutralizing antibody medicine targeted at</u> <u>individuals above 12 years old and adults with mild COVID-19 symptoms</u>. In Phase 3 trials, the drugs showed a reduction in hospitalization and deaths among nonhospitalized clinically vulnerable patients by 78%.





ASEAN+3 and Selected Economies: Vaccination Progress








ASEAN+3: Daily New Cases






