Recent Developments

Global News

- World Health Organization says <u>measures put in place and experience gained in dealing</u> with the delta variant should remain the foundation for fighting the omicron variant.
- The <u>omicron variant has been reported in multiple states</u> in the **US**, including in individuals with no recent travel history, suggesting <u>domestic transmission</u>.
- India reported its <u>first two cases of omicron variant</u> in the southern state of Karnataka. <u>One of the cases has no recent travel history</u>. Both cases had mild symptoms.
- Australia reports its <u>first community transmission</u> of the new omicron variant. Amid hopes that the omicron variant will be milder than previous strains, authorities plan to <u>continue to reopen the economy</u>.

Regional News

- Korea will impose a <u>10-day quarantine on all inbound travellers</u> beginning December 3, 2021, after confirming its first five cases of the omicron variant. Travellers from **Singapore** under the Vaccinated Travel Lane arrangement are exempted.
- Malaysia and Singapore have reported first imported cases of the omicron variant.
- Vietnam will <u>ramp up monitoring measures</u> to guard against the omicron variant, including closely checking inbound visitors who have traveled to or changed planes in countries that have reported omicron cases.

Vaccine News

- Novavax plans to begin commercial production of a vaccine tailored for the omicron variant in January and is evaluating the efficacy of its current vaccine against the variant.
- A **UK** study tested seven different Covid-19 vaccines as booster doses and found most of them increased antibodies. The <u>combination of doses from Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech boosted immunity the most</u>.
- Moderna <u>could have a COVID-19 booster shot targeting the omicron variant tested and</u> <u>ready to file for authorization</u> in the **US** as soon as <u>March 2022</u>.





Aspired 2021 target










