Recent Developments

Global News

- **Europe** is currently at the epicentre of the pandemic, with the World Health Organization (WHO) European head predicting that the <u>continent could see half a million more deaths</u> by February. The rise has been mainly attributed to the slow take-up of vaccines.
- Germany reported the <u>second consecutive day of record-high cases</u> today. State health ministers are <u>considering expanding booster program and implementing restrictions for the unvaccinated</u>.

Regional News

- The recent resurgence in infections, driven by the delta variant has reached 20 mainland provinces in **China**, marking the <u>broadest outbreak in the country since end-2019</u>.
- Japan will reopen borders to business travellers and students starting November 8.
 Fully vaccinated business travellers will have to self-isolate for a minimum of three days.
- Quarantine-free travel between Hong Kong and China is expected to <u>resume as early</u> as February.
- The **Philippines** has <u>lifted social mobility restrictions and reopened universities in Manila</u> following a sustained decline in the number of cases.

Vaccine News

- The United Kingdom has become the first country to approve the use of molnipiravir, a COVID-19 antiviral pill developed by Merck and Ridgeback Biotherapeutics.
- Pfizer has announced that <u>clinical trials of its COVID-19 antiviral medicine</u>, Paxlovid, show a <u>reduction in hospitalization or death risks by 89 percent</u>.
- The WHO has granted emergency use approval for Bharat Biotech's vaccine, Covaxin.
 Two doses of the vaccine is required, with an interval of four weeks. Covaxin is approved for use in individuals aged 18 years and above.





ASEAN+3 and Selected Economies: Vaccinations and Aspired Population Coverage





World: New Cases by Region







Selected ASEAN+3: Aggregate Non-Residentials Mobility


