## **Recent Developments**

#### **Global News**

- Mask-mandate returns in parts of the US as average daily cases rose to above 26,000, a level last seen in end-May. The government is ramping up vaccinations for teenagers and young adults.
- A Lancet study in the **UK** found that <u>50 percent of people hospitalised with severe COVID-19 develop other health complications</u>. This finding contradicts current narratives that COVID-19 is only dangerous in people with existing comorbidities and the elderly. The study covered more than 73,000 patients across 302 hospitals.

## **Regional News**

- Indonesia has <u>surpassed the daily cases in Brazil and India</u> with an average of more than 44,000 cases per day. With the healthcare system facing tremendous strain, the military has deployed its doctors and opened emergency field hospitals.
- Confirmed cases in **Vietnam** rose to a record-high of almost 2,500 cases per day in the last 7 days. The delta variant has been reported in 58 out of the 63 provinces and cities.
- **Myanmar** reported an <u>all-time high of 103 deaths and more than 4,600 cases</u> per day in the last week. 74 townships are under stay-at-home orders as of July 12.
- The Philippines has reported its first locally transmitted cases of the delta variant.
   Among the 16 new delta variant cases today, 11 were locally transmitted.
- Malaysia has granted conditional approval for Sinopharm for emergency use. Sinovac vaccine will stop being administered after supply ends, with vaccination drive to be anchored by Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine going forward.

#### **Vaccine News**

A study published in The Lancet found that the <u>Pfizer-BioNTech</u> vaccine produces 10 times more antibodies than <u>Sinovac</u> vaccine. The paper also cautioned that <u>disease-fighting antibodies</u> do not account for the full picture when it comes to measuring the ability to generate immunity and the effectiveness of COVID-19 vaccines.







## **World: Confirmed Cases by Region**





# Selected ASEAN+3: Aggregate Non-Residentials Mobility


