# **Recent Developments**

## Global News

- **New South Wales** has <u>removed quarantine requirements for fully vaccinated travellers</u> arriving from November 1.
- **New Zealand** reported its <u>largest rise in infections in six weeks</u>, with all cases detected in Auckland, raising prospects of an <u>extension of lockdown beyond next week</u>.
- **Italy's** <u>public and private sector workers will be required to show proof of vaccination</u> as of October 15. Despite a high national vaccination rate, the move has stoked tensions.
- Fully vaccinated travelers to **England** from countries not on the red list will be <u>allowed</u> to take the cheaper lateral flow coronavirus tests instead of PCR tests from October 24.
- South Africa will begin vaccinating children aged 12 to 17 from next week.

## **Regional News**

- Korea will <u>lift curbs on social gatherings next week</u>, as the country prepares to switch to a "living with COVID-19" strategy. Starting Monday, gatherings of up to four unvaccinated persons will be allowed.
- Indonesia has reopened Bali to 19 countries, including China, Japan and Korea.
- **Cambodia** is <u>studying ways to enable quarantine-free travel for fully-vaccinated visitors</u> <u>from low-risk countries</u> after a sharp decline in the number of cases.
- Vietnam will <u>categorise localities based on COVID-19 risks</u>. <u>Stringency of containment</u> <u>measures will also be adjusted</u> based on the risk levels. Areas that have vaccinated at least 70 percent of the adult population with one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine will be assigned as Level 1. Level 4 represents high-risk areas, with more restricted mobility.

## Vaccine News

• Health advisers to the **United States** FDA has recommended <u>a half-dose booster</u> for individuals inoculated with the <u>Moderna's COVID-19 vaccine at least six months ago</u>.









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
