Recent Developments

Global News

In Australia, federal authorities will begin to wind down emergency support for people
who became unemployed due to lockdowns across the country, once the vaccination
rate reaches 80 percent. With this decision, individual states and territories would need
to foot the bill if they decide to implement another lockdown should there be another
outbreak in their locality.

Regional News

- **Singapore** reported <u>about 2,480 new infections yesterday, a record-high</u>, along with two new deaths. The recent trend in new cases <u>has paused further reopening, with tighter restrictions since the start of this week</u>, such as limiting social gatherings to two people and making work-from-home the default mode.
- Malaysia announced yesterday that <u>vaccination for all federal government employees</u> is now mandatory and must be completed before November 1, with exceptions only allowed on health reasons. The move was aimed to compel about 17,000 yet-to-be vaccinated civil servants, ahead of plans to reopen more of the economy this month.
- Japan's state of emergency was fully lifted today, following the steady decline in new infections nationwide and easing the strain in the medical system. Restrictions will lifted in phases over one month.

Vaccine News

- US drug company Merck reported that its experimental oral COVID-19 antiviral drug, molnupiravir, is likely to be effective against the known virus variants, including delta.
 Trial data showed that it is most effective when given early in the course of infection.
- **Japan**ese drug maker Shionogi <u>will start clinical trials for a COVID-19 nasal spray</u> <u>vaccine by next year</u>. The method uses a technology that delivers the vaccine through the nose to induce immunity in the respiratory system.
- **India**'s drug regulator this week gave the green light to the Serum Institute to enroll 7 to 11 year-old children for its trials of the vaccine from US manufacturer Novavax.







World: Confirmed Cases by Region





Selected ASEAN+3: Aggregate Non-Residentials Mobility


