Recent Developments

Global News

- Companies with more than 100 workers in the **United States** are <u>mandated to vaccinate</u> <u>their staff or conduct weekly testing</u>. This directive will affect 100 million people.
- The <u>surge in deaths and hospitalizations in the **United States** have prompted some European countries including **Italy, Sweden** and **Netherlands** to <u>retighten travel</u> <u>restrictions for visitors</u> from the **United States**, particularly unvaccinated ones.</u>

Regional News

- **Japan** <u>extended the state of emergency</u> in 19 prefectures, including Tokyo, until Sept 30. Curbs on travel, large events and serving of alcohol could be eased by November.
- Vietnam plans to reopen the resort island of Phu Quoc to foreign tourists from October. The 6-month trial is open to fully vaccinated tourists with a negative COVID-19 test.
- The recent <u>decline in cases in **Myanmar** has been attributed to lower testing.</u> Positivity rate, measured as ratio of new cases to new tests, remained stable at 10 percent.
- **Brunei** <u>extended current containment measures</u> until October 3. Average daily cases remained above 100 for the twentieth consecutive day.
- Lao PDR <u>extended and tightened mobility restrictions amid surge in community cases</u>. Measures include closing schools in Vientiane and banning private gatherings.
- **Malaysia** <u>eased restrictions on Klang Valley as cases and ICU occupancy decline</u>, while 72 percent of the population have been fully vaccinated. Nationally, cases have trended downwards since early-September, but remain high at more than 19,000 cases per day.

Vaccine News

- **Moderna** is developing a single vaccine that combines a booster dose against COVID-<u>19 with an experimental flu shot</u>.
- **COVAX** revised <u>target for global vaccination in 2021 down by 30 percent</u> to 1.425 billion doses, due mainly to export restrictions on a major supplier, the Serum Institute of India.










