### **Recent Developments**

#### **Global News**

- **United States (US)** has pledged to donate 500 million more COVID-19 vaccine doses to other countries, bringing total vaccine doses donated by the **US** to 1.1 billion.
- **Germany** will stop paying salary subsidies for unvaccinated workers who have to be quarantined. The government hopes this move will boost the vaccination campaign.
- **Italy** has pledged to <u>donate 45 million vaccine doses to other countries by the end of the year three times its original commitment.</u>

## **Regional News**

- The <u>state of emergency in most prefectures in **Japan** could be lifted if infections continue to decline</u>. Daily confirmed cases continued to trend downward since end-August.
- **Vietnam** has <u>delayed reopening Phu Quoc resort to foreign tourists until November,</u> after failing to meet vaccination targets due to insufficient vaccine supplies.
- Average daily infections in **Korea** reached <u>a record-high of 1,885, due mainly to the</u> rapid spread of the delta variant and social gatherings during the Chuseok holiday.
- **Singapore** has <u>reduced dining-in group sizes back to two from the current cap of five</u>, as average daily cases breached 1,000 for the first time since April 2020.

### **Vaccine News**

- A real-world study in Malaysia found that <u>Sinovac vaccine is highly effective against</u> serious illness. 0.011 percent of the 7.2 million Sinovac vaccine recipients required ICU treatment for infections, compared to 0.002 percent of 6.5 million Pfizer-BioNTech recipients and 0.001 percent of 744,958 recipients of AstraZeneca vaccines.
- Novavax has applied to the WHO for emergency use listing of its vaccine.







## **World: Confirmed Cases by Region**





# Selected ASEAN+3: Aggregate Non-Residentials Mobility


