Recent Developments

Global News

- **United Kingdom's** plan to fully reopen the economy by June 21 faces some setback as 6,014 new cases were reported in the past week, the highest since March 6, 2021.
- **United States** plans to <u>donate more than 80 million vaccine doses by end-June</u>. 28 percent of the first 25 million doses are earmarked for Asia. The donation will be sourced from domestic stockpiles of Johnson & Johnson, Pfizer and Moderna vaccines.

Regional News

- Indonesia has <u>cancelled the haji pilgrimage for the second consecutive year</u> after weekly average cases remained above 5,500 for the sixth day in a row. Average cases fell to less than 3,600 in mid-May.
- Malaysia reported 7,736 new cases and 86 deaths per day in the past week, <u>record highs since the start of the pandemic</u>. The Government is <u>considering legal actions against anti-vaccine groups that are undermining the nation's vaccination program.</u>
- Cambodia has imposed a 2 week lockdown in Phnom Penh yesterday in a bid to curb community spread of COVID-19. 7-day average of new cases almost doubled to 650 cases per day after falling to 365 cases per day two weeks ago.

Vaccine News

- WHO has approved Sinovac for emergency use, bringing the total number of vaccines that have been approved by the WHO to eight. Sinovac is the second Chinese vaccine to be recognized by the WHO, after Sinopharm was approved in early May 2021.
- COVAX will receive <u>USD2.4 billion of funds</u> from 40 donor governments, private companies and foundations <u>for vaccine procurement</u>. Belgium, Denmark, Japan, Spain and Sweden will also donate a total of 54 million doses of vaccines to boost vaccine supplies in the near-term.




ASEAN+3 and Selected Economies: **Vaccinations and Aspired Population Coverage**






World: Confirmed Cases by Region


