Recent Developments

Global News

- Confirmed cases in **India** have moderated to average more than 217,000 per day from 400,000 cases previously. Death toll continued to increase, rising by more than 3,500 in the past week. New Delhi plans to reopen the city from May 31 if cases continue to increase at a slower pace.
- With 72 percent of **UK** adults having received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, UK aims to fully remove pandemic containment measures by June 21.
- The **US** has issued a travel advisory on Japan following “a very high level of COVID-19 cases in the country”. The impact of the advisory on US athletes travelling to Japan for the Summer Olympics is uncertain.

Regional News

- Cases in **Malaysia** have averaged above 6,000 cases per day, with more new cases per population than India in the past week. Malaysia has tightened the nationwide Movement Control Order, which will be in place until June 7.
- Hospitals in Osaka are running out of beds and ventilators as cases in **Japan** surged by more than 4,800 cases in the past week. Osaka prefecture is home to 7 percent of the population, but accounts for a third of Japan’s death toll in May.

Vaccine News

- Public Health England has reported that two doses of the **Pfizer-BioNTech** and **AstraZeneca** vaccines are “highly effective” against the Indian variant. The vaccines offer 88% and 60% protection against the B.1617 variant, respectively.
- Singapore** and the **US** have approved for the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine to be stored at refrigerator temperature (2-8 degrees Celsius) for up to 31 days. This approval is expected to accelerate vaccination programs by facilitating transportation and distribution to vaccination centres.




ASEAN+3 and Selected Economies: Total Vaccines Administered
