Recent Developments

Global News

- India reported several <u>record days with spikes of more than 400,000 new cases</u> and close to 4,000 confirmed deaths. Fatalities are assumed to be greatly undercounted.
- **Pfizer/BioNTech** will <u>donate vaccines to athletes and delegates participating in the</u> <u>Tokyo Olympics this summer</u>, which are expected to be distributed worldwide as needed. Vaccination is not mandatory for athletes to participate.

Regional News

- **Cambodia** reported a <u>new daily record of 938 new cases</u> earlier this week. Total confirmed cases stood at more than 17,600 with 114 confirmed deaths.
- Japan is set to <u>extend its current state of emergency for Tokyo and three other</u> <u>prefectures</u> until the end of May. The order was initially set to expire on May 11.
- Starting this weekend, **Singapore** will <u>extend quarantine periods for travelers</u> from highrisk countries and <u>further tighten domestic measures</u>, such as cutting group size limits.
- <u>Moderna's vaccine received emergency approval</u> in the **Philippines**. A first delivery is expected this month. It is the seventh COVID-19 vaccine approved in the Philippines.
- **Hong Kong** will <u>shorten quarantine periods for fully vaccinated travelers</u> from medium and low-risk countries. Entry is currently mostly allowed for Hong Kong residents.

Vaccine News

- As the first country in the world, **Canada** has <u>authorized the use of Pfizer/BioNTech's</u> <u>vaccine for children aged 12 to 15</u>.
- **Europe's** medicines agency has <u>launched a "rolling review" of Sinovac's COVID-19</u> <u>vaccine</u>, the first Chinese vaccine to be studied by the EMA.

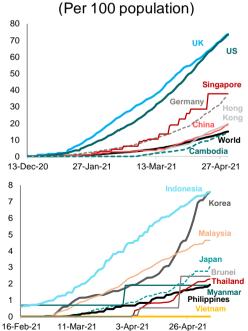

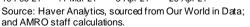

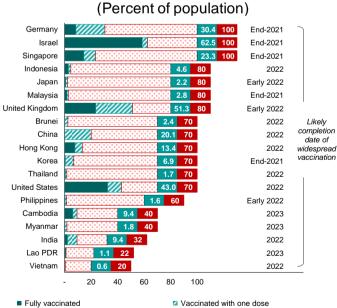
ASEAN+3 and Selected Economies: Total Vaccines Administered

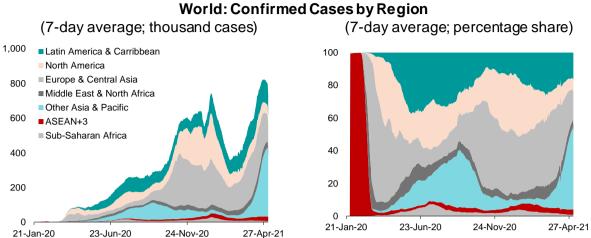

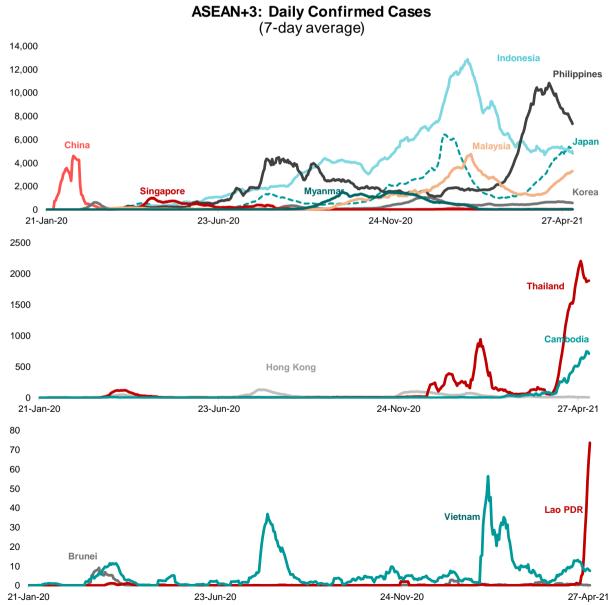



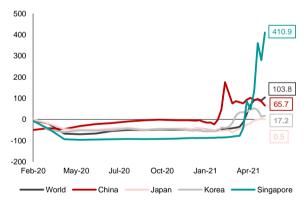
