Recent Developments

Global News

- India registered more than 280,000 daily cases in the last week, <u>surpassing the United</u> <u>States' record of highest daily cases</u> (US highest 7-day average: 255,973).
- The risk of contracting COVID-19 after full vaccination, described as "<u>breakthrough</u> infections", remain very low at 0.5% according to a new study published in the New England Journal of Medicine. The breakthrough infections, which affected 2 out of 417 individuals in the study, were caused by the new variants of the original coronavirus.

Regional News

- Singapore and Indonesia will stop entry for all long-term pass holders, short-term visitors with recent travel history to India, starting from April 24. Singapore is expecting labor supply in the construction, marine and process sectors to be affected.
- In a bid to accelerate its vaccination progress, Hong Kong has lowered the minimum eligible age to be inoculated with the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine from 30 years old to <u>16</u> years old. Minimum age to receive Sinovac vaccine in Hong Kong is 18 years old.
- Lao PDR will accelerate the vaccination of all citizens, with a target to inoculate 22 percent of the population by end-2021 (Previous: 20 percent). As of April 12, more than 140,000 people have been vaccinated with Sinopharm vaccines.

Vaccine News

- **Japan** approved the use of Baricitinib, <u>a rheumatoid arthritis treatment</u> that may be used in combination with Remdesivir, for treating Covid-19 patients.
- Pfizer has confirmed <u>counterfeit versions of its vaccines</u> in **Mexico** and **Poland**. The World Health Organisation has called for the counterfeit vaccines to be identified and removed from circulation immediately.




ASEAN+3 and Selected Economies: Confirmed COVID-19 Cases and Deaths






ASEAN+3 and Selected Economies: Vaccinations and Aspired Population Coverage






