Statistics

- 7,419 new cases were reported across the **ASEAN+3 region** yesterday, the lowest level in several days, though Monday's data is often lower than other days of the week.
- Total confirmed cases across **ASEAN surpassed 1 million**.
- **China** reported 22 new cases, including one domestic case in Shanghai reported in an airport worker.
- The **United States** reported another record of 176,111 new cases, for six straight days of more than 100,000 new cases (*NB: based on JHU data; the Covid Tracking Project data reported 118,497 new cases*). Total cases have surpassed 10 million, with more than 237,000 confirmed deaths.

News

- Germany's BioNTech and U.S. pharma company Pfizer announced interim results from the Phase 3 trial of their coronavirus vaccine. Early data indicates a 90% efficacy after 94 confirmed cases in more than 43,000 trial participants have been observed.
- In **Brazil**, the Phase 3 trial of China's Sinovac vaccine candidate Coronavac has been suspended due to an adverse event in a trial participant. The Brazilian part of the trial, carried out jointly with a local biomedical research centre, includes 9,000 people. Further trials take place in Indonesia and Turkey. Such trial pauses are not uncommon and recently occurred for other coronavirus vaccine candidates which resumed after several weeks.
- **Hong Kong** will extend its social distancing measures by at least another week, including mask-wearing and a ban on gatherings larger than four. Cases have been low, but sporadic cases of untraceable local transmission remain.
- Another head of state has tested positive for Covid-19. **Ukrainian** President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and three other top officials contracted the virus and are currently self-isolating. Cases in the Ukraine have been steadily increasing in recent months and have approximately doubled in the last month.
