

### Statistics

- The **worldwide** <u>death toll has surpassed 900,000</u>. <u>Almost 300,000 new cases</u> were reported yesterday, one of the highest increases to date, for a total of more than 27.8 million confirmed cases.
- <u>Seven new cases</u> were reported in **China**, all imported. China has recorded <u>25 consecutive</u> <u>days without local transmission</u>.
- <u>3,307 cases</u> were confirmed in **Indonesia**, for seven days of more than 3,000 daily new cases within the last eight days.
- <u>202 new cases</u> were reported for **Myanmar**, surpassing 2,000 cases in total. 14 deaths have been confirmed so far.
- An <u>all-time high of more than 95,000 new cases</u> was confirmed in **India** yesterday, with 1,172 new deaths. Total confirmed infections in India stand at over 4.46 million.
- The <u>second waves in both France and Spain continue to edge higher than their respective</u> <u>first waves</u>. France reported more than 8,500 new cases yesterday and cases in Spain rose by close to 9,000 for the second day in a row.

### News

- Indonesia's capital Jakarta will <u>again impose large-scale social restrictions</u> (PSBB), set to start on Monday as it continues to see a rise in cases. PSBB was originally imposed in April and May, followed by a "new normal" of limited capacity in June. Under the re-imposition, nonessential workers will have to work from home, entertainment venues and schools will have to close, and restaurants and cafes will only be available for take-out and delivery.
- **Singapore** will start <u>distributing contact-tracing tokens nationwide</u> from next week onwards. The so called TraceTogether tokens or the TraceTogether app will be mandatory to enter selected pilot venues.
- In Japan's capital Tokyo, <u>requests for restaurants and karaoke parlors to close at 10pm will</u> <u>be dropped</u> next Tuesday, and the metro area's alert level will be lowered by one notch.
- Amid rising cases in the United Kingdom, <u>new restrictions on social gatherings will limit</u> <u>group sizes to no more than six</u>, tightening the current rules that limit gatherings to 30 people.


