Statistics

- More than 590,000 cases have been confirmed across the **ASEAN+3 region** as 7,426 new cases were reported yesterday.
- **Myanmar** reported 24 new cases, one of its highest daily increase to date. In total, 474 cases have been confirmed, including 6 deaths.
- **Peru** continues to be one of the worst affected countries worldwide, both in terms of total daily incidence and per capita daily incidence. More than 9,000 new cases or 277 cases per million population were confirmed yesterday, for a total of almost 600,000 confirmed infections.

News

- In **Korea**, schools and kindergartens in greater Seoul have been ordered to close and move to online classes as a response to a resurgence in cases.
- In **Singapore**, the number of infections amid foreign workers residing in dormitories continues to fall. But for the third consecutive day, a new dorm cluster has been detected at dorms which were previously cleared of Covid-19.
- **Indonesia's** island of Bali has postponed plans to reopen to foreign tourists this year due to the rising level of cases nation-wide. The island opened up to domestic travellers on July 31 and had planned to bring back international visitors on September 11.
- In **Hong Kong**, researches have reported a case of reinfection as a man who had recovered from Covid-19 was infected again several months later with a different strain of the virus.
- 172 countries are currently engaged in discussions to potentially participate in COVAX, a global initiative co-led by the WHO aimed at working with vaccine manufacturers to provide countries worldwide equitable access to safe and effective vaccines, once they are licensed and approved. It is the only global initiative that is working with both higher-income and lower-income countries by pooling funds from participating countries to aid COVID-19 vaccine development efforts and providing participants vaccines using an allocation framework currently formulated by WHO.


