Statistics

- More than <u>111,000 cases</u> have been confirmed across the **ASEAN+3 region**. Out of more than 1,000 newly confirmed cases in the region, almost half were reported in **Japan** and **Indonesia** as both confirmed around <u>250 new infections</u>.
- For the first time since the coronavirus outbreak started, **China** has <u>not reported any new</u> deaths.
- **Worldwide**, total <u>confirmed deaths</u> topped 80,000. Total <u>confirmed cases</u> reached more than <u>1.4 million</u>. With more than <u>300,000 recoveries</u>, the number of <u>active cases</u> worldwide has topped 1 million.

News

- **Japan's** Prime Minister Abe formally declared a one-month state of emergency for Tokyo and six other prefecture. The emergency gives governors the authority to call on people to stay at home and businesses to close.
- In the **Philippines**, the strict lockdown of the main island Luzon was extended until the end of the month. The lockdown was originally implemented about three weeks ago.
- Indonesia's capital Jakarta will close schools and workplaces, limit religious events and
 cultural activities, and ban gatherings of more than five people for an extendable two weeks,
 effective from Friday.
- The lockdown of Wuhan, **China's** coronavirus epicenter, ended today, with outbound travel restrictions lifted. The lockdown first came into effect on January 23—approximately eleven weeks ago.
- In **Korea**, two coronavirus patients recovered after being treated with plasma—a blood fluid—from recovered survivors. Plasma therapy could become an alternative treatment method, but large-scale clinical trials to prove its effectiveness are needed. Several countries have started trials.


